

THE LIZ JONES SERIES OF COMMEMORATIVE WALKS



WALK No. 9 - Membury

A varied walk featuring countryside views, woodland, the charming village of Membury and the attractive hamlet of Rock nearby. Only one real hill (right at the beginning) and a couple of small rises thereafter.

LENGTH OF WALK - 3.1 miles (Allow 1 ½ to 2 hours.) **DIFFICULTY RATING** -

DIRECTIONS FROM LYME REGIS - From Lyme Regis drive through Uplyme to Hunters Lodge and turn left onto A35 (Honiton). Take 3rd turning on right (signed Axminster B3261) and after 0.2 miles turn left (signed Membury 3 ½). Keep straight ahead for 3.3 miles till you reach Star Cross and turn left (signed Membury). Follow this road to the village centre and park in free car park on left opposite the village hall.

The walk is easy; on the level and with few or no stiles.

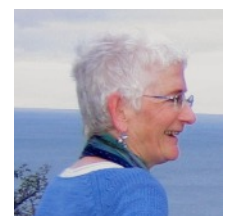
A little more difficult with more stiles and hills.

No. 9 Membury

Go straight across the road from the car park and take the bridleway to the left (signed) in front of the village hall, school and church and follow track to right between the war memorial and the church and go uphill.

At the top of the hill, turn left and immediately right through metal gate into a field (footpath sign). Follow left-hand hedge through two fields with metal gate between them onto a track and through gate down track to a road. Turn left on to a bridleway through the woods (marked). After a short while take the right fork for the bridleway (marked). Ignore any paths coming in from the right and keep straight ahead. Continue straight at junction with a footpath sign pointing left. Continue straight on down the hill to a gate and footpath sign on the left. Go through the gate and turn right through another gate (footpath marker), walk straight across the field through another gate (footpath marker). Follow path over a stile into the garden of house ahead and go through a wooden pedestrian gate ahead.

Turn right and follow track down past houses to a road. Turn left and at a junction marked Membury $\frac{3}{4}$, turn right down a lane past Quakers & Haycroft on the left and follow road over a stream and up past two houses on right rising to Lewsley Farm on left. Go through the double gates ahead and follow the footpath (signed) round the building to the left and up between house and barn ahead and through a gate into a field. Cross field diagonally right through gate or stile in corner of field. Follow path to right through two more gates (footpath markers). Follow path ahead with large ponds on left at Rock Mill. Just before the next gate skirt uphill to miss the worst of a muddy patch in the path a few yards before the gate. Go through gate and through the next large gate at Rock Mill (house sign). Turn right here and join road.

Follow this narrow lane through small hamlet of Rock. Continue along the lane and you will soon be back in Membury with the church, school and village hall on left and the car park on right.
